COMMUNICATION

Indirect/ambiguous/evasive If this person seems not to make sense, it's not you that can't make sense of him, it is he who simply cannot make sense to others.

When you feel pressured, you may find yourself telling someone something that is not true.

She is an idea person who is constantly churning out new and different concepts. Unfortunately, she may have a hard time putting her ideas into workable form because she thinks in a complex manner and is not always able to make others understand what she wants to get across.

This individual may tend to evade, maneuver, or say what he thinks others want to hear.

When threatened by disapproval, this applicant may be inclined to conceal the truth and side-step the real issue.

You avoid by indirection, if not misdirection, on questions whose discussion might work against what you want to do or how you want to appear.

The inability to move smoothly from one thought to another, whether in speaking or writing, may reflect a lack of fluency in expressing one's ideas the essence of what is important.

In conversation, he can maneuver around without giving a direct answer if he chooses, but he can also be direct and to the point.

Not liking to be pinned down about your opinions or attitudes, you remain noncommittal by sticking with conversational generalities and uncontroversial topics.

What I mean is, we can be confused because we tangle ideas up too much or because we have them too well distinguished and cannot see connections. He suffers the latter kind of confusion.

The ability to communicate clearly makes him a good instructor.

He thinks clearly, and he communicates clearly. He values clarity. We have to hand it to the man that he has good judgment as far as he lets us into his mind. However, I doubt that he ever communicates on a personal or intimate level.

His communication will be clear, factual and reliable, as he avoids verbal ambiguity.

Candid There is never any doubt about what she is saying because she says exactly what she means.

Direct She tends to get impatient with a lot of small talk, but prefers to come right to the point.

Blunt

His blunt approach to the truth has a refreshing ring to it.

Non-verbal Although you are a good communicator on an everyday level, when it comes to discussing your deeper, more profound feelings, you don't find it so easy.

She is reluctant to reveal her ideas and needs to be drawn out in order to participate fully.

At times you go from being communicative to being closed up and repressed.

She listens to what is being said, but may not have the level of comprehension that will tell her how to handle a particular situation.

You may be the life of the party, talking about the birds, the bees, the flowers, but you don't talk about your personal feelings. No one could call you shy, but you are, indeed, a private person.

He does not dissimulate, merely maintains his privacy.

It is more comfortable expressing yourself through what you do, rather than what you say.

You need to know you can really trust the person you are revealing yourself to and take a cautious approach before opening up.

She can be communicative or not as she deems appropriate, being most prone to keeping the personal to herself. She can be shrewd or diplomatic.

Articulate/eloquent His thoughts flow smoothly and he is able to move freely from one idea to the next. You are capable of giving reports and lectures eloquently.

It is easy for you to express and present your views, and you do so with ease and eloquence.

Articulate in expressing the benefits of what she is selling, the writer paints word pictures for her listener, to help them visualize how their situation could be improved if only they would close the deal with her.

Painting brilliant word pictures, she shares her mental vision of what the future can look like.

Her ability to verbalize what is in her mind makes her an excellent teacher.

Few have his capacity to move an audience with carefully chosen words spoken so well.

He can be extremely articulate when he has time to prepare ahead, but in an extemporaneous conversation it may be hard for him slow down his thinking and relate to his listener on their level.

His articulate way of expressing his needs and opinions suggests that he is good at getting others to visualize what he has in mind.

A good communicator, the writer has the ability to get his ideas across clearly. He is able to make a good impression by verbalizing with articulateness and creating an environment where his listeners are motivated to take action on his suggestions.

When socializing, you're drawn to intellectual and imaginative conversation.

She elicits cooperation through diplomacy and tact, rather than by being domineering and demanding.

Considerate, helpful and sympathetic to the needs of others, he is

diplomatic and knows how to maneuver out of a difficult situation without causing friction.

Charm and tact are tools he uses to influence the thinking and actions of others.

He can tactfully de-fuse tense situations.

He never forgets to stay tactful and diplomatic, no matter how stressful the situation.

Your discretion in protecting secrets makes you a tried and true, trusted friend. You know when to talk and when to be silent.

You hide your true feelings. Being reticent about personal matters, you can tactfully avoid revealing them, even in the face of direct questions.

He tends to be a selective listener, tuning out what is not agreeable.
