This kind of differential diagnosis is difficult to make because having one "disorder" clearly does not preclude having the other. Many antisocial individuals are also narcissistic, especially when psychopathy is involved.

The Rorschach (and TAT, for that matter) are better at assessing narcissism as a broader construct rather than Narcissistic PD. Indications can be found in mirroring-type responses, but also content suggesting inner emptiness and disturbed sense of self (primitive idealization, shadows, skeletons, caricature figures, etc.).

Also, look very closely at the patient-examiner interactions and subtle (or not so subtle) attempts at wresting control away from the examiner, "perverse" manipulations and role-reversals, etc. You may also want to look at aggressive drive derivative responses (Gacono & Meloy's system) as an addition to standard Exner scores.
